CPD volunteer, Steve Meadows, will lead a program in the basics of canoe water craft operation and safety. He will then guide a leisurely canoe trip around the reservoir to see nature from the water's side of the shoreline. Program registration required and the deadline is Friday, June 17.

Recipe: How to Make Marshmallows

- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- 1/3 cup confectioners sugar
- 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
- 1/3 cup water

- 2/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup light corn syrup
- Pinch of salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Sift the cornstarch and confectioners sugar into a bowl. Lightly grease an 8x8-inch square baking pan and sprinkle 1 tablespoon of the cornstarch-and-sugar mixture into it. Tilt the pan to coat the sides and the bottom. Leave any excess in the pan. Sprinkle the gelatin into the water in a small saucepan and let soak for five minutes. Add the granulated sugar and stir over low heat until the gelatin and sugar dissolve. In the large bowl of an electric mixer, combine the gelatin mixture, corn syrup, salt and vanilla and beat for 15 minutes on high speed, until peaks form. Spread the fluffy mixture in the prepared pan and smooth the top. Leave for two hours or until set. With a wet knife, cut the marshmallow mixture into quarters and loosen around the edges. Sprinkle the remaining cornstarch-and-sugar mixture on a baking sheet and invert the marshmallow blocks onto it. Cut each quarter into nine pieces and roll each one in the starch and sugar.

Place the marshmallows on a cake rack covered with paper towels and let them stand over night to dry the surface slightly. Store airtight; the marshmallows will keep for a month. They are called "marshmallows" because part of the early recipe called for sap from the root of the **marshmallow plant**.

BOUNDARIES WITH KIDS

Date: Saturday, August 20, 2011 - Time: 9:00 A.M. - 4:00 P.M. (6 hrs.)

Description: This class will give you the help you need for raising kids who take responsibility for their actions and emotions.

You will learn the ins and outs of establishing boundaries in your parenting and instilling the kind of character in your kids that will help lead to balanced, productive, and fulfilling adult lives. Learn how to:

• Set limits and still be a loving parent; • Bring control to an "out-of-control" family life; • Apply the "ten laws" of boundaries to parenting; • Define appropriate boundaries and consequences for your kids.

OPPOSITIONAL BEHAVIOR: A LOOK AT ADD, ADHD, ODD, AND OTHER DEFIANT BEHAVIORS

Trainer: Eugene Smiley - Location: Richland County CSB, 731 Scholl Rd., Mansfield

Description: Participants will understand the characteristics and behaviors common to Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD),

Attention Deficit with Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), Oppositional Defiance Disorder (ODD), and Conduct Disorder. Participants will gain understanding of the implications for the child and family that relate to home, community, and school settings. They will also become more aware of interventional approaches and resources, and learn techniques to help with difficult behaviors associated with these disorders.

BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT I: TECHNIQUES FOR HANDLING SURFACE BEHAVIORS WITH OPPOSITIONAL AND ACTING-OUT CHILDREN

My Very Own Blanket is an organization of volunteers dedicated to helping children in foster care feel valued and comforted. We connect diverse people, community groups, businesses and services as we make and deliver personalized blankets and other personal items to children in foster care.

History: Since 1999, My Very Own Blanket has donated more than 23,000 blankets to children in foster care throughout Ohio and distributed 3,633 blankets in 2009 alone. All of the blankets are handmade with loving care by volunteers and every blanket is personalized with the child's name. A blanket is something comforting and familiar the children can take with them from one home to another. It is our intention to give each child something they can call their very own...

Safety Information Facts: The leading cause of death for children are drowning, car accidents, and suffocation. 66% of infant deaths are due to children sleeping on unsafe surfaces & 60% of children were sharing a sleep surface. They noted that cribs should not have bumper pads, because many have suffocated. Cribs, if approved, are safe without the use of bumper pads. There were 11 million cribs recalled since 2007. As of June 2011, cribs will no longer be approved if they have drop down sides. Mini-blinds were also a safety concern due to the strings. Costume jewelry is recalled on a weekly basis due to high lead levels. We have three pages of Child Safety Resources complied by the Ohio Department of Health. Topics include: Safe Sleep, Childproofing, Medication, Lead Poisoning, Playground Safety, Travel, Choosing Quality Child Care, Keeping up with Recalls, and Emergency Preparedness.
