Did you know? People can apply for benefits online or make changes to case information. (Information from the Ohio Fact Sheet)

What is the Online Benefit Application?

The State of Ohio Online Benefit Application is a new Web-based tool that allows Ohioans to apply for food assistance, cash assistance and Medicaid online, wherever they can access a Web connection, simply by logging in at <http://ODJFSBenefits.ohio.gov>. They also can use the tool to update their case information.

How can I use the application to apply for assistance online?

First, find a computer with an Internet connection. Public libraries often have computers with Internet access. Starting in early 2011, Ohio's county departments of job and family services also will have Internet-connected computers available for customers to use. Second, go to <http://ODJFSBenefits.ohio.gov>. You will need to create an e-mail account if you don't already have one. Click on "Apply for Benefits," fill out the information requested and then click "Submit." Be as thorough as possible. The more information you can provide, the easier it will be to process your application.

Description: As sure as parents and caregivers are children's most important teachers, children's ideas about education and its significance begin with parents and caregivers. Therefore, foster parents have a responsibility to participate actively in their children's education. This class will offer caregivers an opportunity to enhance their own skills to assist children with their academic pursuits. This course also serves as a basic introduction to understanding special education and surrogate parenting.

FROM BULLYING TO BEFRIENDING:

HELPING YOUTH CHANGE THE CULTURE OF BULLYING

Description: Nearly 90% of children in grades 4-8, and 80% of youth in grades 8-12 have been victimized by bullies (Hoover, Oliver, and Hazler, 1992; Hoover, Oliver, and Thompson, 1993). As bullying continues to increase, new methods of bullying, such as "cyber bullying," have emerged. This workshop takes an exploratory view of the culture of bullying, the various types of bullying, and useful strategies parents can use to help both bully and victim.
